In 2005, CDEC successfully launched activity packs for Global Education in the Outdoors:

Now CDEC is launching:

Going Global in the Outdoors - an inclusive approach 25 April 2006, Grizedale Forest

On 25 April, CDEC will be returning to Grizedale Forest in Cumbria to launch a new development in GGO - working with pupils with special educational needs.

A new programme and curriculum materials have been developed and trialed with KS3 students and teachers from four special schools across Cumbria and with KS2 and KS3 pupils at risk from exclusion.

The event is free to:

- providers who want to include global education in their work with SEN pupils
- teachers & classroom assistants of KS3 pupils at special schools
- teachers & classroom assistants at Pupil Referral Units
