What do we offer?

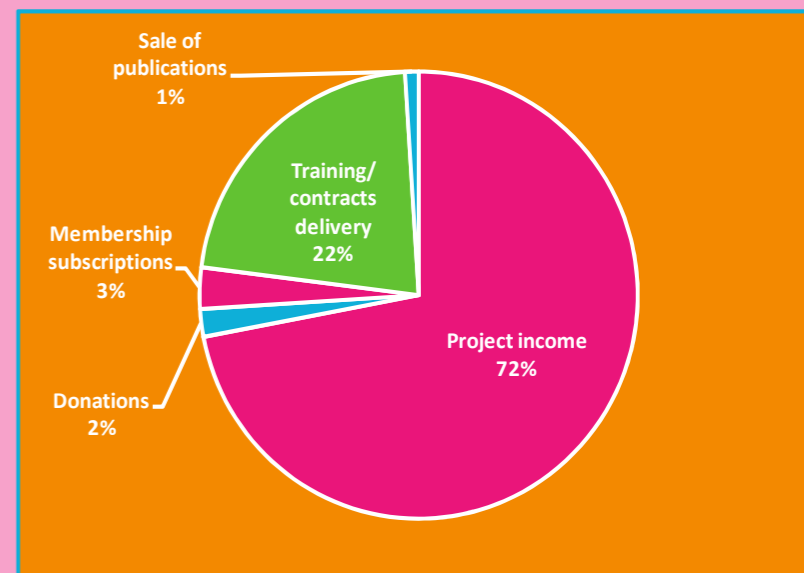
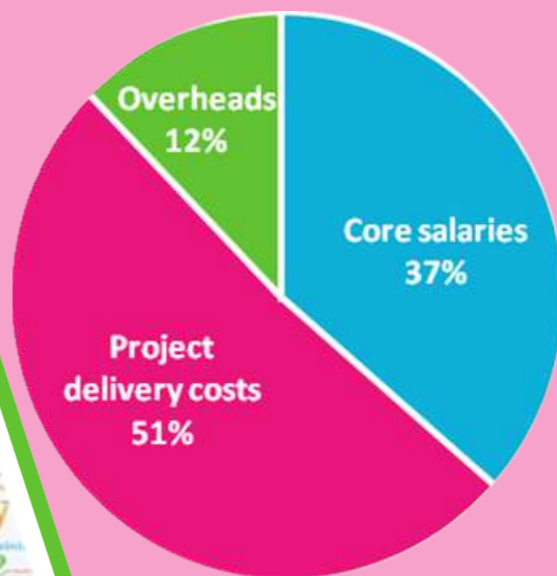
- Training and support for Cumbrian teachers, communities and organisations on sustainability, responsibility, well-being and our place in the global society.

- 16** courses to embed global learning delivered



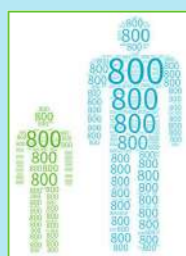
CDEC's third strategic intention outlines how we will develop a sustainable organisation which can continue to provide and contribute to the visions we've set out in our first and second intentions

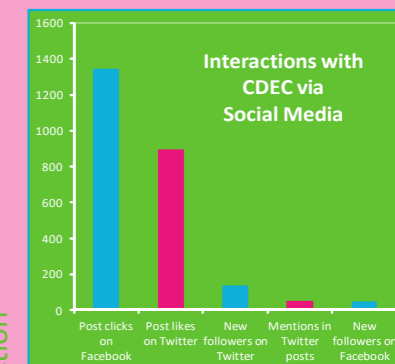
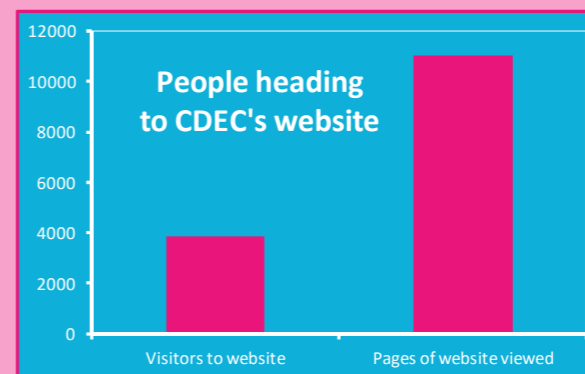
